Use data to identify priority women in your area and inform program strategies and interventions.

### Environmental Approaches

Partner with employers to implement policies to increase screening in partner health systems.

Where can they access care and what are their barriers to care?



### Health System Interventions and Provider-Focused Activities

Conduct assessment of partner health systems, including breast and cervical cancer screening rates, data functionality, process flow, and EBIs.

Where do they live and what community resources do they use?



### Community-Clinical Linkages

Work with community organizations to connect women to cancer screening at partner health systems.

#### Direct Service Delivery:

- Provide appropriate screening, diagnostic follow-up, and treatment referral services.
- Provide patient navigation to address patient barriers.

#### Enhancing Service Delivery:

- Provider reminder systems
- Patient reminder systems
- Provider assessment and feedback
- Reducing structural barriers
- HIT and/or EHR improvements
- Provider education with health systems partners

### Program Collaboration

Work with NCCCP, NPCR, and other chronic disease programs that serve your priority women.

### External Partnerships

Establish formal agreements with health systems/clinics and community-based organizations.

### Program Monitoring & Evaluation

Develop an evaluation plan and monitor, track, and report patient-level and clinic-level data.
