 - a) Two bill updates provided by Jen Pensinger from PaBCC (see attached Flyer) both bills have some time yet until there would be action requested by PCC members
 - 1. SB1225 no-cost breast MRI for high-risk women
 - 2. SB1330 no-cost genetic testing and genetic counseling for women at high-risk
 - b) Update on Prior Authorization and Step Therapy (HB225 and SB225) have made it through the insurance committee; will be up for final passage.
