- Danyelle Gibson (Tower Health) – new member – not in attendance

### **Member Spotlight – Katie Noss focusing on PACHC**

- FQHC – provides high quality primary care services to all patients regardless of their ability to pay. Receives 330 grant, covered under Federal Tort Claims Act (FTCA), Prospective Payment System (PPS), Meets HRSA health center compliance
- FQHC Look-alike – does not receive 330 grant; not covered under Federal Tort Claims Act (FTCA), Prospective Payment System (PPS), Meets HRSA health center compliance
- PACHC’s dental care providers accept Medicaid -one of only practices in the state to do so
- Mozzafarian – can dentist be reimbursed for HPV counseling?
  - Noss – It has not been resolved on if they are able to bill for counseling.
  - There isn’t a monetary incentive for dentists within the FQHC structure to promote the HPV vaccine (counseling) as their payment code is bundled into one code for a variety of services/per visit. It is important to share (counsel) about getting HPV vaccination, within this FQHC dental arm structure no difference in payment for doing so
