## 3 Notes

- **Workplan for 2021-2022 Updates:**

- Strategy 1. Plan for Regional Tobacco Cessation Providers to begin discussions about radon training to introduce the discussion about “testing home for radon” when conversing with public about smoking cessation. This combination approach of reducing lung cancer through smoking cessation and fixing homes with elevated radon levels was a new approach in 2020 and ongoing for 2021.
  - Updates/Progress:
    - Nate Burden: Lyn Robertson and UPMC to test homes in the Allegheny county and anything above 4 they will mitigate for free/low cost those who are low income this is through Lung Cancer **PLUS** study with UPMC. Working with HUD on a low-income and radon mitigation information.
    - Jamie Ruminski and Denise Bleiler: Will start the poster contest at schools. Distributed radon test kits for the Health Equity Pennie Tour and tracking how many actually get returned which could be up to a year.
  - Next Steps:

- Strategy 2. Year-round radon awareness campaign/attempt to move from real estate driven to cancer concern driven option. Increase media attention, not only during national radon action month (January), but to year-round. Consider Health System Approach via cancer committee to adopt smoking/radon as part of lung health.
  - Updates/Progress:
    - Jackie: Finished the CR3 the poster contest and the calendar. The concept this year is superhero and named each one and gave them a story.
      - They will be ready around September 1<sup>st</sup>.
      - Magazine is September and the concept is Child Health Equity with Radon in Schools. Send to Jackie August 5<sup>th</sup> for content.
      - Brenda: Asked about donating calendars and mentioned working with the Pennie tour with the YMCA.
      - Jackie: Asked Benda to email her as she can work to try and get something donated.
  - Next Steps:

    - ACTON ITEM: Order the CR3 calendar to distribute
    - Brenda and Jackie will connect to discuss how they can get the calendars for the Pennie Health Equity tour.
      - Denise mentioned that she gave Eric radon kits for the tour and to loop in Kevin Stewart as he may have funding.
- Strategy 3. Identify and promote Lung Cancer Screening education, activities, resources and tools to smoking cessation providers and lung health stakeholders throughout Pennsylvania to raise awareness and increase referrals and access to lung cancer screening services for eligible individuals in need.
  - Updates/Progress:
    - New course: Shared Decision Making in Lung Cancer Screening The American College of Chest Physicians (CHEST) and Thomas Jefferson University launched a free online educational program on shared decision making to help identify and educate eligible persons for annual lung cancer screening.       - Three (3) Modules and it takes about an hour to go through all of them.

    - Betsy Kopp: Participating in a return to screening project after the pandemic and tracking lung cancer screening rates monthly and the rates have been over what they were pre-pandemic.
    - Shannon Mason: Have a fall cessation class series and a 1st and 3rd Tuesday of the month support group and other virtual options. Open enrollment for all of the support options and will have a newsletter as well. Send Shannon and information that we would like to send out to the patients.
    - Amy Phillips: Started to partner with mission effectiveness team that has a street initiative and loop them into the lung cancer screening initiative. Updated education for residents.

  - Below are updates on the American Lung Association's Saved by the Scan campaign results:
    - The fourth year of the “Saved By The Scan” campaign results are below, highlighting our efforts to continue to help current and former smokers learn about the lifesaving potential of lung cancer screening.
    - 620K+ quiz completions;
    - 26% of quiz completions were at high risk
    - 85% increase in issue awareness about LC screening
    - 75% increase in awareness about LDCT scan
    - 23% increase in high-risk individuals being screened since 2017
