• Workplan for 2023 Updates:

- Strategy 1. Plan for Regional Tobacco Cessation Providers to begin discussions about radon training to introduce the discussion about "testing home for radon" when conversing with public about smoking cessation. This combination approach of reducing lung cancer through smoking cessation and fixing homes with elevated radon levels was a new approach in 2020 and has been ongoing since then.

- Cancer plan should be finished, final edits are completed. Planning on having it posted to the website, cancer page. Brenda will be following-up with this in the next few weeks, discussing the revised Workgroup Action Plan, this follows the new cancer plan.
- The State budget impasse is affecting the Cancer Control Plan, although this is federally funded, we are still being impacted. All contract work is on hold. Mandatory programs such as WIC are unaffected. Dr. Debra Bogen's name was recalled for PA Health Secretary Gov. Josh Shapiro withdraws nomination of Debra Bogen as Pa. health secretary | Pittsburgh Post-Gazette.
- Tracie Gray has moved into a new position with Breast and Cervical Cancer. Brenda and Patrick are working together on the newsletter. Tracie's position will be posted externally beginning July 21st.

• Member/Other Updates:

David Huber- American Lung Association

- No updates, in the middle of a three month grant extension with DOH.
- Continuing tobacco cessation and policy work in the Southcentral region.

o Jackie Nixon- Citizens for Radioactive Radon Reduction (CR3)

• Khadijah is settling into her new position at Temple University, no updates to report right now. Currently focusing on stigma in smoking with cancer patients, smoking disparities (particularly menthol), and making connections in the Philadelphia area.

- Nate will be attending the Radon Region 3 Stakeholder meeting that will be held September 25-26 at the Hershey Lodge. For more information <u>Course Schedule | Radon Courses</u>. The Premier Youth Ambassadors for Radon and the American Lung Association will be attending as well.
- Working with state senators and representatives to get Radon Bill passed that will mandate radon testing in schools.
- Working to get the National Radon Action Plan recognized. This is sponsored by the American Lung Association <u>The National Radon Action Plan 2021–2025 (lung.org)</u>. Nate asked the question, could the NRAP be incorporated into PCC?
- Nate is creating a training course for kids that teaches how the lungs work, and how to protect your lungs. This training is geared towards elementary school children, Nate is hoping to get this program into public schools throughout the state.

 - Denise added that there is some federal funding that can be used to help get radon test kits out to childcare facilities.
