## 3 Notes

- **Workplan for 2021-2022 Updates:**
  - Strategy 1. Plan for Regional Tobacco Cessation Providers to begin discussions about radon training to introduce the discussion about “testing home for radon” when conversing with public about smoking cessation. This combination approach of reducing lung cancer through smoking cessation and fixing homes with elevated radon levels was a new approach in 2020 and ongoing for 2021.
    - Updates/Progress:
    - Next Steps:
  - Strategy 2. Year-round radon awareness campaign/attempt to move from real estate driven to cancer concern driven option. Increase media attention, not only during national radon action month (January), but to year-round. Consider Health System Approach via cancer committee to adopt smoking/radon as part of lung health.
    - Updates/Progress: Nate Burden, AARST was able to present on Radon for the Northeast Tobacco-Free Coalition in March and will be presenting to the Southcentral Tobacco-Free Coalition in June. Continuing to ensure that our tobacco service providers are incorporating radon education and testing into their daily work.
    - Eric Rothermel, YMCA Center of Healthy Living, completed 4 stops already of their Health Equity Tour and gave out all of the 75 Radon Kits that they received from Denise. They have noticed that education and awareness surrounding radon is out there and people are very interested in testing their homes. They have requested 200 more kits to give out during future stops. The tour will end February 11, 2022 and they will be visiting all 67 counties in PA. Visited already Dauphin, Lebanon, Lancaster, Berks. Next up is Schuylkill County.
    - CR3 has started the new National 2022 CRCPD Poster winners School Radon Calendar for September 2021- August 2022. Target release date is September 2021 for distribution.

- Next Steps:

- Strategy 3. Identify and promote Lung Cancer Screening education, activities, resources and tools to smoking cessation providers and lung health stakeholders throughout Pennsylvania to raise awareness and increase referrals and access to lung cancer screening services for eligible individuals in need.
  - **Updates/Progress:** American Lung Association has updated most of their materials for the new lung cancer screening guidelines. They can be found [HERE](#) on lung.org. Lung Association also continues to educate regional tobacco-free coalition meetings on lung cancer screening integration.
  - Lyn Becker, PA DOH DTCP is working with NAC and MD Anderson Cancer Center in Texas to incorporate lung cancer tool they developed for the PA Quitline. There have been 4 different states have used the tools and other states have joined on. Screening intake determines if callers are eligible for LDCT scans. Provide them with education on LDCT and encourages them to discuss the resources with their family physicians. This information will be on the PA Quitlogix website and hoping to put on the cancer divisions website as well.
  - Ron Meyers, Jefferson will be presenting their lung cancer learning communities white paper at the PCC meeting on June 17<sup>th</sup>. Also working on a Shared Division Making Training that will be available in June for providers to participate in.
    - Lyn Heyman, Suburban Community Hospital asked clarification on who the audience is for the lung cancer screening training.
    - Training targets all types of allied health professionals, physicians, tobacco treatment providers, health educators, etc.
    - CMS has not adopted the new guidelines yet and this may take awhile. Education to insurers and payers is important! The American Lung Association has the following [Insurance Chart](#) available.
  - YMCA Center for Healthy Living has added Cancer Screening to their Health Equity Tour and will be educating individuals about LDCT screenings.
  - As part of our State Lung Cancer Screening Coverage Project in partnership with The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center, the Lung Association has released a [toolkit](#) for stakeholders to learn about the recently expanded US Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) lung cancer screening recommendation and work to update insurance coverage policies to align with the new guidelines as soon as possible. We have also updated [our 2019 toolkit on Medicaid coverage of lung cancer screening](#) to reflect the updates to the USPSTF guidelines as well.
