#### **Action Plan and Other Updates**

- The Family Health Tree / engaging adolescents tool is in need of development.
  - Genomics team is working on something similar, but focused on genomics and genetics – can we collaborate? Fern will reach out to the co-chairs:

    - Alanna Kulchak Rahm <u>akrahm@geisinger.edu</u>
- Prostate Task Force is not active.
- Grant Young with Adagio focuses on policy work; he has joined the Policy Work Group.
- Also the Policy Work Group is expected to work with the various PCC subcommittees.
- *Via Brenda*: We need to focus on prostate cancer and prostate health moving forward. We need to work on policy.

- As a coalition we must get out there as a group, networking and attending events.
- Fern mentioned the events calendar of past and upcoming events as a way the MHWG is already getting out there. Events calendar: <u>https://docs.google.com/spreadsheets/d/1E-p9V34mgcZlt8sA-</u> <u>TNr\_KY07dMIIZdi/edit#gid=588647346</u>
  - Brenda wants to coordinate with Brian about this.
- In process of putting together next 10 yr. cancer plan.
- CCCP is starting a new 5-yr grant period with 5 areas of focus:
  - 1. health equity
  - 2. prevention,
  - 3. screening and early detection,
  - 4. diagnosis and treatment
  - 5. quality of life of survivors
  - Brenda shared that the CCCP may want to restructure work groups and suggested that the Men's Health Work Group consider becoming a subcommittee of the Disparities Group. This would help to streamline work and expand resources, better align the work with the new cancer plan, reduce gaps, and help our focus. This merger would eliminate co-chairs and there would be work group leads, instead. Concerns from MHWG members were:
    - Does this add or take from our final goals and plans?
    - Does a merger, meaning a larger team, shift our agenda so much that we lose sight of our intent?
    - Does it reduce or remove our control over our current plan?
    - MHWG will meet to discuss this, Fern will organize this meeting.
  - $\circ$  Ultimately the decision is up to the PCC and workgroup members.
  - The MHWG will meet with the Disparities group at some point.
- CDC funding to the state has been cut except for enough to retain two staff to support the PCC.
- The NCCCP has made a big switch in funding to all of the states. Money is no longer being allocated for implementation but is now focused on the coalition's implementation of the cancer plan. CCCP programs are to support coalition efforts and act as a liaison between the NCCCP and state efforts.
  - For comprehensive cancer control, PA gets zero dollars for implementation of the state cancer plan with the exception of funding that is passed through the DOH to 4 of the cancer institutes: Penn, Pitt, Penn State and Northeast Regional and a small amount to the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society. We need to up our game and advocate for state funding for cancer beyond the required match for the Breast and Cervical Early Detection Program and Cancer Registry.
  - The Comp Cancer program needs to get funding all hands are needed on deck, need to fill the gaps.

- We have data that identifies our burdens and disparities. This data needs to be used to ask for funding to be allocated equitably and based on burden.
- We need an educational campaign to educate PCC members on advocacy and outreach to policy makers and legislators, how to write a letter, find out who your representative is, attend key events to access policy makers
- We need a new focus on policy and advocacy.
- CHW mods may live on PCC website- CCCP is working to get a platform added to the website which enables trainings to be housed.
- Do they still need SCORM files- Brenda will find out from Tracie and April.
- TUH can post the CHW course?
  - Brenda asked that we try to count usage and who we disseminate it to.
